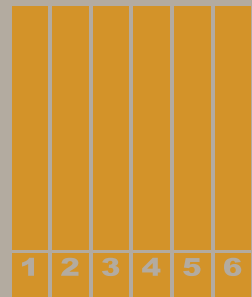
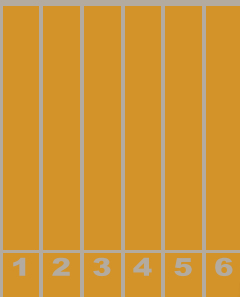

CAMP ANDREW JACKSON is a weeklong overnight camp during the months of June and July. Camp begins Monday morning and ends Friday afternoon. Youth camps run 5 days, and teen camps run 4 days.

WE BELIEVE each child is a unique individual with their own special talents and strengths. We seek to provide activities that allow all children to learn new skills and to experience success.

We seek to provide all activities in a safe manner and:

- Have trained lifeguards on staff
- Require children to wear life jackets anytime they are near the lake. In the swimming pool, life jackets are worn unless the camper passes a swimming test.
- Provide training to all camp staff and volunteers
- Have medical personnel on staff

TO APPLY: To apply, please complete our online application at www.christianapp.org/campaj or call us at **606.287.7073** to request a paper application. Camp AJ must receive your completed application and your \$20-per-child camp fee before your application will be reviewed for placement. If you are unable to pay the full camp fee at this time, please call us to discuss other arrangements. Limited scholarships are available. Once these steps are complete, you will receive a confirmation letter in the mail detailing your camp information or you will be contacted by camp staff to discuss your application. If you have any questions, please call Camp AJ at **606.287.7073**.

TRANSPORTATION: Transportation is available to and from camp each week to residents of Rockcastle and McCreary Counties. There are limited spots available, and transportation services will not transport your child to camp if they have not received a confirmation letter. We are unable to provide transportation to and from other counties at this time.

WHAT TO BRING AND WHAT NOT TO BRING

Clothing (Old) As Follows:

Shorts, Shirts, Socks, and Underwear for each day. One-Piece Bathing Suit or Trunks, 2 pr. Gym Shoes, Sweatshirt, Raincoat, Pajamas, (Please mark the clothes as campers have a tendency to leave them at camp)

Personal Hygiene Items:

Toothbrush, Toothpaste, Hair Brush, Soap, Wash Cloths, Towels, Shampoo, Deodorant, Needed Medications**

**To be in original containers only!

Campers SHOULD NOT Bring:

Money, Food, Jewelry, Tobacco, Weapons, Personal Electronics (iPod, Video Game Systems, Cell Phones, etc.)

Children are not allowed to use the phone, but parents may call and speak to a staff person if they are concerned about how their child is doing.
